Attendance



New data published by Tusla Education Support Services (TESS) shows that one in five children in primary and post-primary school are missing a month or more of their school year. The 2023/24 report indicates that while non-attendance is decreasing it is still significantly greater than pre-pandemic levels. TESS and the Department of Education and Youth launched a national multimedia campaign to highlight this nationwide issue and create awareness about the importance of attending school. The campaign reinforces the message that **when a child can go to school they should go to school**, helping to reduce absenteeism in schools in Ireland. We remind parents that pupils should be in school every day unless they are sick. **Good Attendance and class contact time are vital to a pupil's success in school.** Our attendance motto in St. Joseph's is **H.E.R.O. (Here every day, ready on time).** **Pupils who are absent 20 days or more are reported to TUSLA and also discussed with the Education Welfare Officer.** Instruction missed while a pupil is on holidays will not be revisited again as the teacher must progress to the next stage of instruction. Pupils in receipt of support with a SET teacher who miss a lot of time due to holidays may have their support slot reduced on return. We thank you for your support with this.
